

THE LIBRARY

One of the important coponent of a college is the library furnished with standard books on the topics to be tought. Well furned library has been established with about 3256 books on different topics of education. There are provincions for internet, Photostate and spaces and facilities for day study. Library cards shall be issued to the proinces, so that they may get books from the library to take it to their home. However, the trainees should have to refund the books after a fixed period for better circulation of the books among the students. The journals, daily news papers etc. will be made available for study & reading in the college itself.

THE COMPUTER LABORATORIES

A hall containing 10 computers has been set for the trainees. In this age of information technology, knowledge of computer is essential. Therefore, well furnished computer laboratory has been established. The computer lab has also been connected with the internet. After having the basic information of computer the trainees will get much infromation about the recent development in the field of teachers education. They can draw or download these information from the internet so that they may get much infromation. The Computer education will also help the trainees when they will join the school.

THE LABORATORY FOR THE CRAFTS

Separate laboratory equipped with facilities for tailoring, music, drawing, card board painting doll preparation, carpenter works etc. has been establifshed. In this laboratory students wil do the work according to their chance. The craft work is also an essential part of teacher's training. Here, they will get opportunity to reveal the hidden talent among them. Therfore all facilities will be provided to the students to take benefits of this branch.

THE EXCURSION TOUR

All the trainees will have to participate in the excursion tours organized by the B.Ed. faculty. The place of tours shall be either a historical place or some natural place. The students shall have to prepare a project report based on the observations made during the excursion tour. The project shall contain how the journey was completed. What was the outcome of the interaction of the trainees with local people or the persons who have come from the other parts to participate or visit the places. Finally what message is obtained from the place must be revealed by the students in his concluding remarks.

ELIGIBILITY

Any candidate securing 50% marks in B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com hons, exam from any recognised university of India or equivalent Degree from any foreign university can apply for an entrance test to be organized by the college. The date of examination shall be communicated to the applicant, Relaxation in the percentage of marks shall be provided to the ST, SC & OBC Categories of Students. Only appearing in the test examination shall not form the basis of selection.

HOW TO APPLY

Candidates should apply on the prescribed form. The form and prospectus for applying to the course can be obtained from the counter of the B.Ed. College office (from 10.30 AM to 03.30-PM) by paying Rs. 500/- in cash or through the post by sending a DD of Rs. 600/- in favour of the Principal. MODE OF ADMISSION

The admission shall be done strictly on the merit list, prepared from the marks obtained at the entrance test. 50% of the total seats will be reserved for condidates belonging to SC, ST or OBC classes. Any kind of approach for admission will be considered as the demerit of the candidate. The SC, ST or OBC. Should produce caste certificate issued by the Civil SDO.

IN THE CAMPUS

There will be a dress code for the students of B.Ed. faculty. All students have to come in the uniform. No students will be allowed to enter the classes, theories or practical, if he or she is not in the uniform. A Blazer, bearing the monogram of the college shall be provided the winter. Laminated Identity card shall be provided to each student. All the students have to keep it with them all the time in the campus.

Behaviour of the students in the campus, breach of peace, discipline, use of any unparliamentary words, misbehavior with the fellow students, misbehavior with the teachers or any staff will be watched continuously. Students found guilty will be expelled from the college and he or she will forfeit the claim of the money deposited in the form of fees. Therefore, trainees should have to maintain the peace, discipline in the campus. There should not be any kind of ragging practice in the campus.

INDOOR OUTDOOR GAMES

Provision have been made for indoor & outdoors games. Carroms, Chess, Table Tennis will be the items of indoors while, Badminton, Volley Ball, Football, Kabaddi, Cricket etc. will be the items of the outdoor games. Participation in the games will be considered as an extra activies.

THE SEMINAR, QUIZ, DEBATES ETC.

All students will have to take part in the above activities. The faculty will organize seminar, debate or quiz which students will express their ideas and concept. That will also be evaluated.

THE TEACHING JOB & LESSON

Ten pioneer schools situated in the area within 5 kms. from the college, have been selected where trainees will be provided teaching job and lesson. They will have to prepare a job report which will be duly certified by the principal of the selected high schools. The project will be evaluated at the time of practical examination.

THE ENTRANCE TEST

The duration of the test examination will be of 2 hours. There shall be two parts, part A and Part B. Part A will consist of 80 questions each of one mark only, while part B. Shall contain 20 Marks each of one mark only. The questions will be of objective type with muliple choice. One question will have four options. The correct should be selected.

- The test items of Part-B i.e. subject awarness and competence will be based on the curriculum of IXIX classes prescribed by the Bihar School Examination Board / NCERT / CBSE / ICSE or equivalent examining bodies.
- All the test questions will be given in a composite test booklet, which be available in English and Hindi versions. The candidates many attempt the test in any sectional order, i.e. (I to V mentioned above) they like, since the questions in the test booklet would be objective multiple type. As such answers will not be required to be written in words or sentences. For each question, there will be four probable answer choices of which one of them whould be correct the candidates will have to select one correct answer from amongst the four probable answers give in the booklet. In case, none of the four alternative in correct, then the condidates will have to mark 'O'.




